PROGRAMS

ECHO TOMORROW FIELD – Food and Art stems from three themes. 1. Artworks inspired by the history of Tango, a region that once produced cinnabar, 2. Attempts to innovate with rich local ingredients and revive the textile industry, 3. Art rooted in the land through collaboration with the next generation. The venues will be in Tango and Kinosaki.

Introducing Shu:

Vermillion in Japan and Next Generation Culture Zone

Takano / Itsukinomiya Shrine

-The only Grand Shrine in Takano (founded in 2nd century BCE)

Field of Stars, A Little Prayer Takano / Itsukinomiya Shrine will be the site of an art project created through collaboration with the land and younger talents in the fields of arts, crafts, and architecture.

Tango Ancient Village Museum – Museum of Tango Kingdom Ni Installation that reflects on the layers of primitive, ancient, and contemporary life through the lens of the color vermilion in Tango.

Local, New and Fermented

Roadside Station Tenki Tenki Tango

-Roadside station on the site of Takano Ruins (3rd Century B.C.)

Restaurant for Tomorrow A space for new soul food produced by the chefs of cenci and Nawaya, and room of textiles from Tango.

Regenerative Art-Next Generation Craft Architecture

Taiza Studio — Center of TOMORROW FIELD (since 2021)

Nature Room

In the spirit of the sensibility of the younger generation and artists who have inherited the traditions of woodworking, ceramics, glass, papermaking, and plastering, a 100-year-old house in Taiza has been turned into an artwork over the course of three years. It is now open as a shop selling original crafts and artworks.

Kinosaki Onsen Mikiya

-Long standing inn inspired the novelist Naoya Shiga (established in 1716)

Ceramics and sculpture in dialogue with the history of architecture and place

Two-person show of ceramic artist, Akio Niisato and artist, Yoshihiro Suda



- Shinmeiyama Tumulus (Miya Tangocho):

- One of the largest tumuli along the Sea of Japan (5th Century) $% \left(\frac{1}{2}\right) =0$
- Onaru Burial Mounds (Takano Tangocho):
- Burial mounds overlooking the Sea of Japan (early 7th century)
- Niu Shrine (Iwaki Tangocho): Ancient mining site of cinnabar
- Tateiwa (Taiza Tangocho): The 20-meter-tall monolith (Miocene epoch)
- Nawaya (2517 Kurobe Yasakacho): Seafood & vegetables from Tango *Reservation-only.
